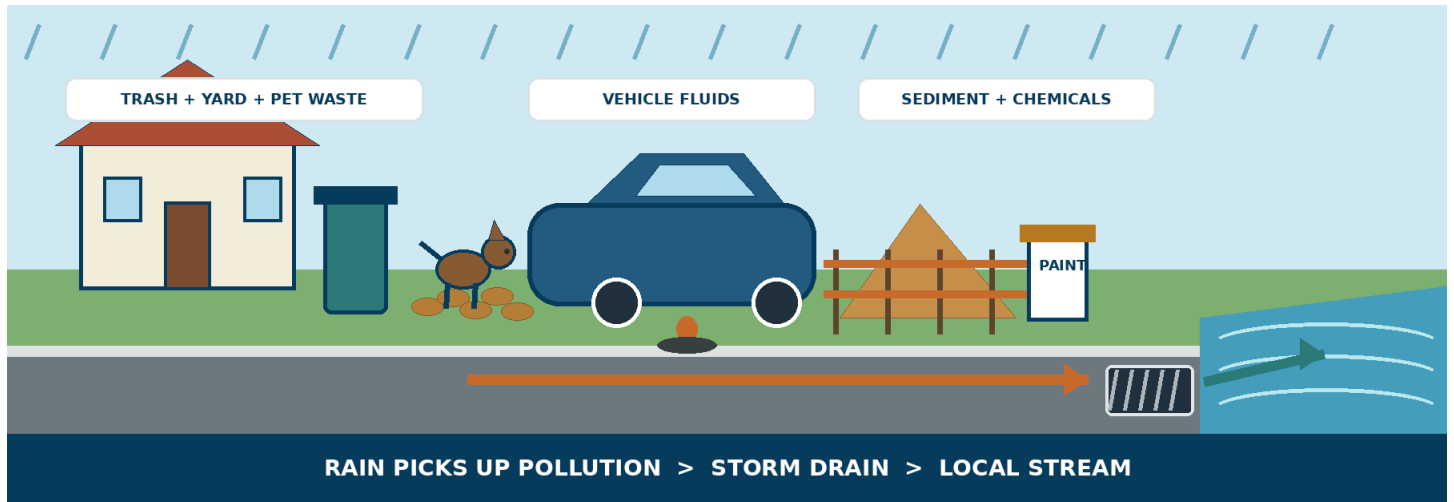




STORMWATER POLLUTION PREVENTION

What we do on land affects the water we share.



Stormwater runoff is not treated before it enters local waterways. Rain can carry everyday pollution from homes, streets, parking lots, and work sites directly into the storm drain system.

START AT THE SOURCE | SIX SIMPLE ACTIONS

CONTAIN TRASH

Bag trash and recyclables and keep containers closed.

WATCH FOR: litter and loose trash

STOP VEHICLE LEAKS

Repair leaks and recycle or dispose of vehicle fluids properly.

WATCH FOR: oil, grease, and antifreeze

CONTROL SEDIMENT

Stabilize disturbed soil and maintain erosion controls at work sites.

WATCH FOR: bare soil and muddy runoff

SWEEP YARD WASTE

Sweep leaves and grass; never push them into the street.

WATCH FOR: leaves and clippings

PICK UP PET WASTE

Bag pet waste every time and place it securely in the trash.

WATCH FOR: waste left in yards or parks

KEEP CHEMICALS OUT

Never pour soaps, paint, or chemicals into a drain. Report spills or illegal dumping.

WATCH FOR: wash water and household chemicals

ONLY RAIN BELONGS IN THE STORM DRAIN. Prevent pollution at the source.
