

MUNICIPAL ORDER 06 - 2022

A MUNICIPAL ORDER OF THE CITY OF BERE A, KENTUCKY, DECLARING CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLES TO BE SURPLUS AND AUTHORIZING THE MOTOR VEHICLES TO BE DONATED TO THE WOLF COAL VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, Breathitt County, Kentucky, and the Wolf Coal community in Breathitt County, have suffered catastrophic flood damage from a flood on July 28-29, 2022; and

WHEREAS, Breathitt County and the Wolf Coal Community are in desperate need of continuing fire protection subsequent to such flood; and

WHEREAS, the City of Berea has a surplus tanker truck which is suitable for use by the Wolf Coal Volunteer Fire Department; and

WHEREAS, the Wolf Coal Volunteer Fire Department is recognized by the Kentucky Fire Commission and is under the supervision of the Breathitt Fiscal Court so that such fire department constitutes a governmental agency within the meaning of KRS 82.083; and

WHEREAS, the City of Berea desires to transfer such surplus vehicle to the Wolf Coal Volunteer Fire Department instead of selling same as surplus, pursuant to KRS 82.083;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BERE A, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

That the following motor vehicle is hereby declared surplus as set out as follows:

1. 1994- 4700 International, VIN1HTSCAA8SH644998
Gorman Rupp 400GPM Pump
1850 gallon water tank
2000gallon dump tank
Obtained for use by the Fire Department

The afore-referenced motor vehicle is hereby declared surplus because it is no longer suitable for use by the fire Department considering the cost to maintain and insure

it, so that it is in the public interest to dispose of such vehicle, and the Mayor is authorized and directed to dispose of same by transferring the motor vehicles without consideration to the Wolf Coal Volunteer Fire Department pursuant to KRS 82.083(3)(a).

Adopted by the Berea City Council this 6th day of September, 2022.


