- Ellipse Street Shared Use Path Project had begun with an approximate ninety-day completion date

- Pickleball Courts construction had begun. Brian Reed, Assistant Codes Administrator, had done an exceptional job implementing the project. The pickleball courts were added to the budget this year and fifty percent of cost had been sponsored by Tourism.
- The annual Berea Spoonbread Festival was scheduled for September 19th September 21st. The Chamber of Commerce had requested his presence, along with City Council's presence, to serve Spoonbread on Saturday, September 20th. He assured them they would be there in support of the Chamber and the Festival.
- Thanked and recognized the Berea Police Department for the work they do. They were doing a lot of good work behind the scenes, which he hoped to share in the future. Really proud of them.
- Berea Pool Renovation Project was moving along well. Concrete had been poured, slide had been installed, liner had been installed, and pool was currently being filled to get liner protected and start the pumps, and complete any final testing.
